FINO AFTER SCHOOL MATH TUTORING PROGRAM

WHATS GOING ON...

The FINO afterschool math tutoring program pairs junior and senior calculus students with freshmen who are finding Algebra 1 challenging. Through one-on-one and small-group mentoring, tutors help freshmen make sense of abstract concepts, build confidence, and stay on track.

SOMETHING SMALL TURNED INTO SOMETHING BIG

What started as a small pilot program in Spring 2024 with just 15 students has now grown, demonstrating incredible results. All participating freshmen have improved their grades, with many jumping from D's and F's to C's or higher. More importantly, they've gained confidence, completed more homework, and engaged more in class. As one student put it:

"I helped my classmate with a question in class today!"

TUTORS

Tutors don't just reinforce math skills—they inspire. With specialized training before and during the program, they learn how to guide without giving answers, support without judgment, and break down complex ideas in ways that make sense. Freshmen benefit from a structured, two-day-a-week commitment, where they review current content and preview upcoming lessons—helping them feel prepared before new topics even hit the classroom.

The Impact

The impact is clear: students stop seeing math as a roadblock and start seeing themselves as mathematicians.

And when students believe in themselves, the entire school benefits.


